



## Stopping green power: Bill 276

On June 3, 2021, Ontario's Bill 276 became The Supporting Recovery and Competitiveness Act.

This omnibus bill included numerous measures the Ford Government claimed would bolster an economy pummeled by a pandemic. As ever this government regarded efforts to counter climate breakdown as impediments to prosperity.

Schedule 5 of Bill 276 revoked provisions of the 1998 Electricity Act that had required that renewable energy projects get priority grid connection. Why? Doug Ford's spokesperson claimed the prioritization of renewables created unnecessary cost.<sup>1</sup>

So, Ford assumed the most perverse of postures. Jurisdictions around the world are scrambling to move away from fossil fuels, rapidly replacing them with renewables. Ford chose

As we stand now 96 per cent of Ontario electricity is fossil free.<sup>2</sup> But Ford plans to spend three billion dollars building new gas plants to fill in for nuclear plants scheduled to come offline or be refurbished. Astonishingly, rather than clean up the environment Ford plans to adulterate it. It is estimated by Ontario's Independent Electrical Systems Operator (IESO) that the gas plants will increase greenhouse gas emissions by more than 300 percent by 2025.<sup>3</sup>
